Love: 9 10 **DISCUSSION ITEMS** 5. 11 12 5.1 **University Ave. Study Corridor Presentation** 13 We'll move on to our item number five, Discussion Items, Presentation on 14 Love: 15 the University Avenue Study Corridor present. 16 Thank you Mr. Chair. This afternoon we have Denise Weston with 17 Murphy: Bohannan Huston to give a update on the University Avenue Study 18 Corridor that we've been working on in the past few months. We spoken 19 about here before, what, we've completed the second round of public 20 involvement. We're in the process of finalizing the, the draft Phase A 21 report. We had originally hoped to get it to you at this meeting but we're 22 not quite there yet so we'll get it, get it to you in January. We're, I guess 23 24 the, the first draft there is being passed out, out to you, course don't expect you to comment on it and we're not asking for approval today but 25 Denise is here to kind of give, give a rundown and a wrap-up of the, of the 26 27 project and then we'll come back next month and ask for a recommendation. 28 29 30 Denise Weston gave her presentation. 31 Mr. Chair. Denise just one question. Is, is there a City bus that goes 32 Gwynne: 33 through this on this route? 34 35 There is. And there's actually a transit stop. There, it would be identified Weston: in one of the front maps in the plan. There's a transit stop on the north 36 37 side near that neighborhood on the west end, there's an existing stop there. Yes. 38 39 40 Gwynne: Okay. So that would be taken into the, the pedestrian facilities on the side. Would there be a, a bench or, or a stop plan? 41 42 Right now there isn't actually a stop plan for that location. There's just a 43 Weston: place where it stops. But that's a good question. I, I, and I've been 44 communicating with Mike a little on that. Maybe we can follow up a little 45

more closely on what your expectations are for that area.

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1 My concern is, is right now we have a lot of congestion right there when 2 Hanway: the school is letting out and it's actually throwing our routes off timing 3 4 cause there, there's no relief for the cars or the buses to get off the rightof-way. So are they looking into doing any type of cutout for the school or 5 6 anything like that? 7 8 No. Weston: 9 Because right, right now it, it, it's pretty bad. 10 Hanway: 11 Now the school as I understand it, as we were working with them through 12 Weston: this process, they actually have some planning underway to do some of 13 their own management of traffic on their land separate from this study. So 14 at this time the, the right-of-way in that area is the right-of-way that's 15 established and that's how that roadway would function. Now I think that 16 it's worth considering. I don't know that if you would need a bus pullout as 17 you make your stop to the west. You're saying that's not necessarily the 18 problem, the problem is just getting through that traffic. 19 20 21 Hanway: Right. 22 23 Right. Weston: 24 I wouldn't necessarily recommend a bus cutout for the buses but more for 25 Hanway: the, the traffic that's going to the school. They have a lot of ... 26 27 28 Weston: Yeah. 29 30 Of parents that, that go and pick up their children there and, and they're .... Hanway: 31 32 Right. Weston: 33 Parking just on the right-of-way. So ... 34 Hanway: 35 Right. Well, and that's why we're trying to provide the pedestrian and 36 Weston: bicycle facilities in hope that maybe some of those people will get out of 37 their cars but it is very trick, tricky because the right-of-way just isn't there 38 to provide enough space for on-street parking and we are trying to work 39 with the school so at the end when these improvements come out there 40 could be some recommendations on traffic management but other than 41 that it's very hard during those pickup and drop-off times to design a 42

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time.

1 Hanway: I, I agree. And as far as the school though if they're going to, if they're 2 willing to do a study is this something that you guys would incorporate with 3 them? 4 5 Weston: Oh absolutely. I think that they are working, if I may, correct they, they, 6 they were at the, one of the last meetings and they're looking at just some 7 other internal queuing of cars to get some of them off the street when 8 they're dropping off or picking up. Right. 9 10 Hanway: Thank you. 11 12 Weston: And as a comment I'll note that perhaps I can get a status update in the 13 final report on what their, their status is of any improvements they might 14 have and it, the answer may be, "At this time we're not doing anything," 15 but I'll make sure there's a status update in there, in the report. 16 17 Hanway: Okay. Thank you. 18 19 Love: Any other comments? Thank you Denise. 20 21 Weston: All right. Thank you. 22 23 6. COMMITTEE AND STAFF COMMENTS 24 25 6.1 City of Las Cruces, Dona Ana County, Town of Mesilla, Las Cruces 26 Public Schools, RoadRUNNER Transit, SCRTD Project Updates 27 28 Love: Okay. Moving on to item number six, Committee and Staff Comments. 29 30 Murphy: Mr. Chair. I guess at this point of the agenda we'd, if any of the, the 31 Members want to give updates on projects that their agencies are working 32 on that they, they feel is a, worth sharing so we hear, like to hear from the 33 Committee. 34 35 Love: We'll go, we'll go down the list. City of Las Cruces, anything? 36 37 Grijalva: Mr. Chairman. This is in regards to the LC00130, the El Paseo Safety 38 We're in the process of trying to get a right-of-way road project. 39 certification I guess cleared before we can actually award the, the 40 project to a local contractor. So as soon as we, we get that all squared 41 away then we can move forward with the, the awarding of that contract. 42 LC00190 which is the Las Cruces Dam Trails Project, we have 43 given an initial recommendation of award to a local contractor. NMDOT 44 and FHWA did review all the bids and documents and, and, and 45 suggested that they didn't have all the proper documentation and so we're

going to a, another bidder that had submitted a bid on the project. So

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1 we're in the process of writing the recommendation of award letter. 2 Hopefully we can get NMDOT's concurrence and move forward with the 3 contract award. 4 5 Love: Thank you. Dona Ana County. 6 7 Molina: Thank you. The project that I did want to give a little bit of input or 8 information on is the Dripping Springs, Dripping Springs/Baylor Canyon 9 Roadway Project that was out to bid. The lowest bidder is, is Mountain 10 States Construction and we're looking at moving forward with them. 11 We've got a pre-con that's coming up in the next two weeks and looking at construction starting in mid to late January. So keep, be on the lookout for 12 that and the, the project will, will be there. Try to, we don't see too many 13 14 issues but we'll be starting that project. Thanks. 15 16 Town of Mesilla I see you don't have any current projects. We have Love: 17 representative from Las Cruces Public Schools? No. okav. 18 RoadRUNNER Transit. 19 20 Hanway: Well I, Mr. Chair. Like to welcome the South Central RTD into the Intermodal Center. We finally got the MOA signed today so they will be 21 22 starting with us hopefully on Monday, correct? That's it. 23 24 6.2 **NMDOT Projects Update** 25 26 Love: Okay. And DOT projects are pretty much what's, what's in the packet 27 here, (inaudible) a road study, we're just waiting for the notice to proceed 28 for, to do the Phase B. The Phase B involves coming up with some 29 recommended alternatives, alignment alternatives as part of the study. 30 US 70 intersection with Spitz, Solano, and Three 31 Crosses, that project is still scheduled to be let in June. 32 US 70 through San Augustin Pass, that RFP has been awarded. I'm not aware who got the award, I was just told that it has been awarded 33 to a contract, or to a consultant for design so, and that project involves 34 35 widening US 70 through the San Augustin Pass to include, to be able to 36 put a bike lane through and connect, and have connectivity on both sides 37 of the pass. 38 US 70 interchange, waiting for the award for that RFP. The US 70 39 Safety and Capacity Study, that's a, a study to look at six-laning US 70 40 from Solano all the way to I-10, to I-25. And that one has also been 41 awarded but I, I, I'm not aware of who actually received the award. But it 42 should be coming out soon.
